

### **Does "Talk Only" Submission Help?**




Variance for 19.7% acceptance rate, 90 submissions: 0.04

• Type of submission did not form part of PC discussion.


- Clearly, some referees did not even look at the type of submission.
- Possibly some correlation due to author's choice of submission type.


#### Number of Submissions vs. Time (Days)



#### Number of Submissions vs. Time (Hours)


#### Number of Papers vs. Time Before Deadline






Hours Before Deadline (4 Hour Bins)

#### **Acceptance Rate vs. Submission Num.**




There appears to be an advantage to submitting in the last day -- but exact hour doesn't matter.
